**Demande ou Question:**

- 2.13 Le promoteur croit qu'il y aurait des coûts pour assurer la sécurité de la municipalité. La compagnie s'engage-t-elle à payer ces dépenses ?
- 2.13.1 Quels en seront les coûts et quelles facettes de la sécurité devraient être améliorées ?
- 2.13.2 Est-ce qu'une entente a été réalisée avec la municipalité ?

**Réponse:**

- 2.13 To the extent that the presence of the terminal results in additional training requirements or additional equipment for local emergency response agencies, Energie Cacouna will defray those costs. As was indicated at the hearing, the proposed tax agreement with the municipality will provide additional funds to the municipality to cover such increased costs related to the fire department. (DT3, 3300-3307) However, Energie Cacouna expects that it will be self sufficient with respect to emergency response and maintaining the safety of the municipality.
- 2.13.1 The specific areas that may require additional training and/or equipment are yet to be identified but will be part of the ongoing dialogue within the Comité Mixte Municipal Industrielle (CMMI). It will be a part of the CMMI's mandate to determine appropriate emergency response measures.
- 2.13.2 Although there is no written agreement regarding Cacouna Energy defraying the costs referred to above, Cacouna Energy did express during the hearing that it would be prepared to defray such costs. As well, Cacouna Energy has signed an agreement with the Municipality of Cacouna regarding the payment of property taxes in an amount with is several multiples of the municipality's existing annual budget and will provide funds that can be used to ensure that the municipality's fire

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protection and emergency response resources are adequate for its needs.
