Subject: Proposed Niobium Mine in Oka (Niocan)

l recently attended all the BAPE (Bureau d'audience publiques sur l'environnement) hearings in Oka, concerning the potentially adverse effects from the proposed mining project, the week of January 17th 2005 and was *outraged* to see that there was not one representative from the Department of Indian Affairs present at these hearings.

On January 27th 2005, I spoke with Michelle Moisan, the Regional Environment officer for the Department and she was indeed aware of these hearings being conducted but informed me that the Department was not *invited* to participate. Since when does the Department of Indian Affairs need an *invitation* to participate in the protection of our rights, interests, and well-being-first and foremost the safety of our drinking water and the air we breathe? The Department is so concerned about our safety that it dug deep into the coffers and found \$9 million dollars in less than a year to combat alleged "criminal activity" yet when it comes to real safety and health issues, the Department is nowhere to be found.

I would like to know what the Department of Indian Affairs is going to do, especially when one of your own research scientists, Miroslav Nastev, from the Department of Natural Resources Canada, states in the newspaper <u>La Presse</u> that he found discrepancies in Niocan's calculations and that the mine will produce more pollutants than what Niocan is claiming.

I am therefore insisting that the Department of Indian Affairs finance a new independent study to be conducted for the effects on the ground water, air pollutants, and any other contaminants, for the Mohawks of Kanesatake.
